This volume reveals the complex meanings inherent in the selection of the pigments used in the manuscript, offering a fascinating look into a previously hidden symbolic language. Drawing on cutting-edge approaches in art history, anthropology, and the material sciences, the book sheds new light on one of the world's great manuscripts—and on a pivotal moment in the early modern Americas.
