Die als Kriegslokomotiven in die Eisenbahnliteratur eingegangene Baureihe 52 gehört auch über 60 Jahre nach dem Bau der ersten Maschine zu den bekanntesten deutschen Dampflokomotiven. Eine Vielzahl erhaltener Museumslokomotiven in ganz Europa hält das Interesse an diesen robusten und im Betriebsdienst bestens bewährten Lokomotiven wach. Grund genug, diesen Maschinen einen Band in der EK-Reihe Eisenbahn-Bildarchiv zu widmen, der sich dem Werdegang der Loks bei der Reichsbahn in der DDR widmet. Ob in der Originalausführung, als GR-Lok (General-reparatur), mit Kohlenstaubfeuerung oder als Reko-Lok der Baureihe 52.80 - alle Varianten dieser markanten Maschinen sind in rund 100 hervorragenden Schwarz-Weiß-Bildern vertreten. Der Band erinnert auch an die wichtige und unverzichtbare Rolle der einstigen Kriegsloks beim Wiederaufbau in der DDR, kompetent vom bekannten Eisenbahnfotografen und 52-Lokführer Dieter Wünschmann verfasst.

Nach dem erfolgreichen Verkaufsstart als Taschenbuch ist nun die Premium-Edition von "pomnik parowóz" erschienen. Polen verbinden viele Eisenbahnfreunde sofort mit Wolsztyn - Plandampf pur, von den Einen geliebt, von den Anderen wegen der früheren finanziellen Unterstützung aus dem Königreich spöttisch als Spielplatz der Briten bezeichnet. Doch Polen bietet viel mehr für Eisenbahn- und Technikliebhaber. 319 Normalspurdampflokomotiven gibt es im Land zu bestaunen - viele mit preußischen oder deutschen Wurzeln. Sei es als Denkmal, als Wrack in der Hoffnung auf bessere Zeiten oder als Museumsstück in liebevoller Pflege durch die zahllosen Eisenbahnfreunde des Landes. Das ist zwar nur die Hälfte der in Deutschland erhaltenen Loks. Darunter befinden sich aber neben den Vertretern der polnischen Erfolgsbaureihen zahlreiche weltweit einzigartige Exponate aus der ersten Hälfte des 20ten Jahrhunderts. Ein enormer historischer Schatz mit hohem Besuchswert! Aber wo findet man die Lokomotiven? Wolsztyn natürlich kennen die Meisten, dass es in Chabówka und Warszawa Museen gibt hat man gehört, aber danach wird die Informationslage deutlich dünner. Bis jetzt! Dieses Buch soll Ihnen auch ohne Vorkenntnisse als Reiseführer dienen. Ihnen die Standorte der Lokomotiven zeigen, deren aktuellen Zustand dokumentieren und die Geschichte wie auch die Geschichten der Fahrzeuge erzählen. Entstanden ist dabei ganz bewusst keine eisenbahnhistorische Zusammenstellung von Tabellen und Daten, sondern eine Geschichte aus dem Einsatzalltag. 700 Fotos von gestern und heute - davon über 200 in Farbe - lassen Sie in die Welt polnisch-preußischer Eisenbahngeschichte eintauchen. Nicht alle Bilder würden Platz in einem Hochglanz-Fotoalbum finden, doch werden sie hier ganz bewusst gezeigt - weil sie ungestellt den Alltag der Dampfeisenbahn zu Zeiten eines strikten Fotografiervorbotes auf der anderen Seite des Eisernen Vorhangs zeigen. Diese einmalige Materialsammlung wurde von über 100 Menschen aus 12 Ländern beigesteuert. Erfahren Sie auch, welche Chancen seit dem Fall des Ostblocks vergeben wurden, mit welchen Schwierigkeiten der Dampfbetrieb in Wolsztyn zu kämpfen hatte und wie die polnische Staatsbahn PKP ihr geschichtliches Erbe betreut. Tauchen Sie in die Lokfriedhöfe der 1990er Jahre ein. Lernen Sie Museumsprojekte kennen, die es leider nicht geschafft haben.

The period from the 1890s to the mid-1950s is generally considered the "golden era" of passenger rail travel in America. It was a time of celebrated locomotives and luxurious passenger service, a time when rail technology saw its greatest advances and railroads became the nation's favored mode of transportation. These glory years come alive in *American Passenger Trains and Locomotives Illustrated*, 1889-1971. For this volume, author and illustrator Mark Wegman has researched original railroad drawings and in some cases even paint chips to render more than 160 profiles, front and top views, and interior layouts depicting the steam, diesel, and electric locomotives, along with passenger cars, of three dozen of the nation's most celebrated trains of the golden age. Accompanying the author's drawings are histories of each train, period photographs, postcards, menus, luggage stickers, vintage print ads, and detailed captions. The book is a lavishly appointed journey back in time to the bygone heyday of passenger-train travel.
